East Coast means as far south as 30°N.
At no time are you to proceed more than 100 nautical miles off shore.
As a reference, this navigational area extends as far south as Jacksonville, Florida.

Zone 2

East Coast means as far south as 20°N.
At no time are you to proceed more than 100 nautical miles off shore.
At no time are you to proceed to the territorial waters belonging to Haiti and Cuba.
As a reference, this navigational area extends as far south as the Inagua Islands of The Bahamas, and includes all islands of The Bahamas, and The Turks and Caicos Islands.

Zone 2
▼ Coastal waters not south of this point.

Zone 3

East Coast means as far south as 9°N.
At no time are you to proceed more than 200 nautical miles off shore.
At no time are you to proceed to the territorial waters belonging to Haiti and Cuba, or continental South America and islands belonging to the South American continent.
As a reference, this navigational area extends as far south as Trinidad & Tobago to Aruba, Bonaire, Curacao. It also extends to, but not into the Panama Canal.

Zone 3
▼ Coastal waters not south of this point.
